Nutley Family Service Bureau 2015 Annual Report

Dear Stakeholders and NFSB Supporters,

NFSB has truly come full circle this past year as we embraced a new Strategic Plan, which reinforced a Nutley-focused, social service direction to the existing emphasis in mental health services. Stakeholders, staff, board and public officials were consulted as we aligned our programming and philosophy with that of the local community. The new Vision statement "A community where mental well-being is valued as an integral part of life" began to look more like a realistic possibility, as we embraced the Mission "To strengthen the emotional and social well-being of individuals and families through affordable mental health counseling and social service programs". The Plan reaffirmed NFSB's "Nutley First" commitment, where psychotherapy services are available to Nutley and surrounding communities, and where the social services, free / reduced-cost programs, and community outreach are directed primarily to Nutley.

In June, the Strategic Plan was approved by the Board of Trustees, and was immediately tested. Within days, we received news of the closing of Nutley American Red Cross, directly next door. NFSB quickly rallied to explore purchase of the building and to take on the Nutley Food Pantry, a long-standing community service. In December, ARC accepted the bid, and we began planning to re-start food disbursement in 2016, using ARC volunteers who agreed to continue. This new space addressed other Strategic Plan issues, and put NFSB in a strong position to serve the community in 2016 and beyond.

In other 2015 highlights, our main work continued to be delivering quality, affordable, and accessible psychotherapy services. In December, our clinical team of 2 full- and 7 part-time staff serviced an active caseload of 309 clients; the 2015 monthly average of sessions was 492. Both figures continue to grow year-to-year, showing our services are needed for people with mental health, family and emotional/psychological concerns. This reimbursable service provides significant portion of revenues, since most clients have private insurance.

We remain committed to helping those in need, including people with limited financial resources. We offer a sliding scale fee schedule to anyone not insured, with more favorable rates for Nutley residents. And in a major change, last fall NFSB was approved by the Medicaid Insurance Panel, and to be reimbursed with NO co-pay by client. By December, it opened our services to 35 Medicaid recipients. Nutley residency is considered a priority when scheduling. In addition to private services, clinical staff and interns provided a variety of mental health and social services to Nutley residents. Qualified staff was available when unexpected needs arose, such as emergency evaluations for school children, or referral requests from town leaders. Four MSW and/or MA graduate students provided social service programming and, 2nd year graduate students handled some cases within our psychotherapy program. Interns performed general case management for walk-in and phone clients, verified eligibility for the food pantry, ran free social skills groups for school-aged children, and helped program planning and group services at two township senior residence buildings. In return, interns gained the supervision and work experience required for graduate credit.

In April, we began an exciting new initiative, the NET (Nutley Empowering Teens) Program, developed in conjunction with Nutley Police Department. It is an 8-week group curriculum for teens identified at-risk for substance abuse or other self-sabotaging problems, and conducted by a licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselor. As of this writing, over 20 teens graduated from the program, which includes family sessions and individual or family treatment when necessary or requested. It is a free for Nutley initiative.

We maintained the Women's Group, Anger Management Group and added a group for DADs (Dads Behaving Dadly). Our Female Teen Leadership Group also continues for its 3rd year and its roster is steady at 9 participants. All of these group programs are free to participants.

Additional revenue sources that support NFSB are listed on the financial statement. NFSB strives to use these funds wisely - 87% of expenses went to provide services to clients and community. The Nutley Township grant (\$65,000) assists the accessibility and retention of qualified professional staff, and enables free programming to Nutley residents, as guided by our "Nutley First" policy. Over 350 individuals and companies made unrestricted donations last year – we are humbled and thankful. One unique source continues to be the amazing volunteer-run Thrift Shop (over \$66,700), selling new and used clothing & household items.

We want to take this opportunity to thank you. If you became a client or referred a neighbor to our professional service, gave a donation, volunteered at the Thrift Shop, donated clothing or housewares, we are grateful. Thanks to you, we are able to move our Vision forward each and every day.






