

# 2016 Annual Report

Dear Friend of Nutley Family Service Bureau,

Thank you for contributing to the success of NFSB in 2016, a year full of change, growth and transition. We have navigated the twists and turns by keeping our vision aligned with our Strategic Plan. We continue our 100+ year mission of strengthening the emotional and social well-being of individuals and families through affordable mental health counseling and social service programs. The 2016 Annual Report is an opportunity to share with our supporters a few highlights of the past year and to offer a glimpse of our anticipated goals for 2017!

NFSB's diverse list of services and programs places the organization in a unique position to impact the community on multiple levels. As our local community evolves, NFSB is committed to remaining responsive to its present needs and to preparing to meet the community's future challenges.

#### **Psychotherapy and counseling:**

- Growing number of clients: increase of average active cases (25%, 369/month) and new clients (35%, 443/year).
- Cases include adults, children, couples and families
- Expanding insurance panels (26) which include Medicare and Medicaid
- New adjusted fee schedule
- Free Group Therapy sessions, including Women's and Men's Groups
- Free Workshop sessions for children, teens and seniors
- Free Case-management services
- Growing graduate and undergraduate internship programs

### **Nutley Food Pantry:**

- Final purchase of 169 Chestnut St.
- Food Pantry reopened in January, 2016
- Expansion from 35 households after relaunch to 80 in December
- Proud partner agency with Community Food Bank of New Jersey
- Recipient of 2016 Scouting for Hunger Donation Drive
- Sharing 80 holiday meals for the 2016 Thanksgiving Initiative
- Edible Education community outreach series sponsored by ShopRite of Nutley-Belleville
- Growing list of individual, group and corporate food donors

Dear Friends,

Some points of 2017 information to share

- Eileen Painter, our new Executive Director, and Felicia Gardner, our newly designated Director of Clinical Services and Programs, have partnered beautifully to lead our tremendous organization and our programs for Nutley. Together they have helped to ensure our future serving the community.
- The Nutley Zoning Board of Adjustment approved our redevelopment plan for 169 Chestnut St.
- The 2017 Boy Scout Food Drive for the Food Pantry topped the 2016 drive with unprecedented community involvement!
- Nutley Township grant, previously at \$65,000 per year, was reduced to \$32,500 in 2017, and slated to be eliminated in 2018. However, in July Commissioner Rogers informed NFSB a \$25,000 reinstatement would be made in 2018, primarily to support the Food Pantry. Specifics on this welcome change will be forthcoming.
- Finally, watch for our new 169 Chestnut facilities combining the Food Pantry, the Thrift Shop and Social Services in early 2018!





#### Notes for Total Net Funds:

1. Capital improvement reserve does not include any amount for the renovation of 169 Chestnut Street anticipated to cost around \$300,000.

2. The contingency reserve reflects the amount necessary in the event that operations are interrupted for six months and covers fixed costs such as non-variable labor and insurance, which continue through the interruption.

3. Future Investments provides funds for new programs, new facilities, establishment of endowments, etc.
