For Nutley Family Service Bureau, 2018 was a year punctuated by "opening new doors." We were able to open the door to NFSB's renovated Food Pantry after 12 months of redevelopment, permitting our patrons to return to the familiarity of 169 Chestnut Street. The Christmas holiday provided an opportunity to open the doors to our Thrift Shop patrons and offer a "sneak-a-peek" shopping experience while the finishing touches of the new shop were being finalized.

In addition to opening physical doors, NFSB opened doors to new opportunities for our mental health clients. A growing commitment to group therapy for various ages and mental well-being needs allows us to complement traditional methods of psychotherapy and improve access to diverse treatment modalities.


PSYCHOTHERAPY

- Serves adults, children, couples and families
- Averages 452 active clients per month
- Accepts 27 insurances including Medicaid and Medicare

- Staffed by licensed clinicians, some specializing in alcohol and drug counseling and bilingual counseling
- Free group-therapy sessions and workshops
- Free case management services

- Maintained over 200 households on the Food Pantry roster
- Provided over 150 holiday meals during the Thanksgiving Initiative
- Collected over 29,000 non-perishable food items during the Boy Scout Food Drive




2018 Audited Financial Information

- NFSB welcomed a new Director of Clinical Services and Programming, Joseph Armentano, as our former director, Felicia Gardner, transitioned to a new role within the Psychotherapy Center.
- The newly redeveloped facility at 169 Chestnut Street opened quietly with our redesigned Thrift Shop and additional psychotherapy and administrative offices.
- The Food Pantry was reorganized and relocated to our updated space in the lower level at 169 Chestnut Street with access by elevator in time for the 2018 holidays.
- The 2019 Scouting for Food Drive, which benefits the Food Pantry, topped all previous food drives. We were welcomed into Franklin Reformed Church for the event and subsequent processing. We surpassed the 2018 Food Drive due to continued and unprecedented community involvement!
- Last, but not least, the former NFSB Thrift Shop building at 170 Chestnut Street was sold and the transaction completed in July 2019.
